






Dear Parents and Carers,

We are well and truly in the run up to Christmas now and the children have been learning about the church season of Advent - 'a four-week season in the Church calendar dedicated to anticipating the arrival, or "advent," of Jesus of Nazareth, the long-awaited Messiah and King.'



Advent

We have lit the first candle on our Advent Wreaths this week. This is a purple candle that represents HOPE and is the PROPHECY CANDLE. In the following weeks we will be lighting the BETHLEHEM CANDLE which represents PEACE and is also purple, the SHEPHERD'S CANDLE which is pink and represents JOY. The final purple candle is the ANGEL'S CANDLE which represents LOVE. The final candle in the middle is white and is known as THE JESUS CANDLE and, in churches, is lit on Christmas Day.



Stir Up Monday

The Sunday before Advent, which is five weeks before Christmas, is called Stir up Sunday. The name comes from a prayer that

Anglicans say, which is: 'Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people'. This is a way of reminding Christians to get ready for the arrival of Christ at Christmas.

Mrs Bufton-McCoy and Revd Joanne came into school so that the children could help make a Christmas pudding and make a wish as they stir it.

Reverse Advent calendar

As we approach the festive season, I am excited to introduce a wonderful initiative we will be participating in this December: a Reverse Advent Calendar.

Traditionally, an advent calendar counts down the days until Christmas by offering a small treat each day. In contrast, our Reverse Advent Calendar encourages us to give back to our community. Instead of receiving, we will be donating items to our local food bank, helping those in need during this special time of year. This is instead of asking you to bring in items at Harvest time.

How It Works: We invite each family to bring in one non-perishable food item each week throughout December if you can. Here's the schedule:

Week I (November 25-29): Canned goods (e.g., vegetables, soups)

Week 2 (December 2-6): Toiletries (shower gel, shampoo; handwash)

Week 3 (December 9-13): Snacks (e.g., biscuits, cakes, dried fruit)

Please send your contributions to school on the designated days, and we will collect them for the food bank. This is a fantastic opportunity for our children to learn about generosity and the importance of helping others.

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
