On Wednesday 15th January, KS2 took part in the next cross-country race at Pingles, Nuneaton. Thankfully the ice had melted and the sun was out which made a much nicer climate for running. Our Year 3 and 4 girls raced first, with Nessa just missing out on a medal - coming in in 4th place. Imagen was second back in 14th, closely followed by Georgia in 17th, Tess (23rd), Sybill (27th) and Kezia in 28th. For the boys, Arlo came in 3rd place earning him a medal in the race. Rory C was second back for the boys' race, finishing in 13th, Others taking part in the race were Rafe (22nd), Oliver (40th), Chester (46th), Ronnie (54th), Samih (56th) and Jack in 65th. In the Year 5 and 6 race, Elsie was first back for the girls in 19th, followed by Arabella in 23rd and Lucie in 48th. For the boys, Freddie finished in 9th place, Lincoln in 13th, Jack M in 14th, Jacob in 19th, Dougie in 27th and Archie L in 31st. Well done to the team.
