

KS2 Cross-country From Miss Griffiths

On Wednesday 11th December, our school cross country team travelled over to Pingles Stadium, Nuneaton, for their next fixture of the season. Six girls braved the 1km Y3/4 race, with medal success coming in for Nessa who raced her best yet coming 3rd overall. She was quickly followed by Tess (6th place and her best position so far), Imogen (11th), Georgia (13th), Kezia (14th) and Chloe in 28th. This was the girls' strongest performance of the season so far with their combined scores likely to be the lowest out of all competing schools. For the boys, Rory C narrowly missed out on a medal, coming in 4th and his personal best performance of the races so far. Rafe also managed a top 10 position - coming in 8th overall. Chester was next home in 26th, Oliver in 33rd, Ronnie in 24th and Jack F in 40th. A little while later, the Y5/6s took to the track for their first lap which made it a speedy start without any mud. They then completed two laps around the perimeter of the stadium totalling I mile in total. For the girls, Amber and Arabella ran well, coming in 13th and 23rd. For the boys, Freddie W made the top 10, finishing in 8th position. Jack M finished in 13th position - his highest position of the season so far, with Hugo making his XC debut in 14th. Lincoln was next in 23rd, followed by Archie L and Jack Mc in 32nd and 33rd. Well done to all for embracing the cold weather. See you all on January 15th for the next instalment.

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
