ONLINE SAFETY MESSAGE

In today's digital age, our children are more connected than ever before. While technology offers incredible opportunities for learning and social interaction, it also presents challenges that require our attention and guidance. One area of particular concern is the use of group chats and online communication platforms.

Monitoring your child's online activity, especially in group chats, is crucial for several reasons. Firstly, it helps ensure their safety. Children may not always recognise the risks associated with sharing personal information or engaging with strangers. By keeping an eye on their online interactions, you can help protect them from potential dangers such as cyberbullying, inappropriate content, and online predators.

Encourage them to think before they type, to be considerate of others' feelings, and to stand up against bullying. 
Y5/6 Cricket
