Thanks to both PTAs for funding these treats.














### Newton Regis Community Garden

### VINTED UNIFORM

As part of the Government green policy, all schools are required to have a climate action plan by September 2025.



One of the actions we would like to do is re-using uniform as much of this ends up in landfill.

The staff are working their way through washing all of the current donations that have been kindly given to school because their child had left Y6 or because they have grown out of them.

Y6 will then take charge of this environmentally friendly initiative by displaying the donated clean uniform at the same time as ice-cream Friday. There will be a box for any donations so you could just do a straight swap as well as an honesty box if you just wish to buy items (suggested donation of 50p per item).

All proceeds will go toward the Y6 Leavers treat like the ice cream money but, more importantly, will support the environment through our climate action plan. The bonus of this is that you get to save money on uniform that your children grow out of really quickly

I have been approached by a few parents about bringing their child to the nursery at Newton Regis. Just to clarify, we take children the term after they are 3. All children are entitled to 15 hours for which we offer 5 mornings. You can then apply for 30 hours if you are working which means you can add some or all afternoons.

We are currently full for this academic year and have a waiting list in case anyone leaves.

We are now full for 2025/26 academic year so if your child turns 3 in the summer of 2026 and you would like them to join our nursery in September 2026, please get in touch now to secure your place. We already have 8 of the 13 places filled!
